Longfellow Middle School Curriculum Night Course Selections



Students will enter their course selections into SIS StudentVue.

Counselors will teach students how to input courses during the elementary visits.

Students select the following courses:

- Math
- Electives
- 4 alternate electives

Changes can be made in SIS StudentVue until February 26th.

Longfellow will automatically enroll students in English, Science, U.S. History, and Health and PE

Longfellow Middle School Curriculum Night Elective Courses



- Classes are exploratory and students should consider their interests and talents
- Semester electives
 - Half year courses- students receive a new schedule after 2nd quarter with new elective
- Full year electives
 - World Languages, Band, Orchestra, Chorus, AVID
- Students should NOT pick classes to try to be with friends
- Student must select 4 alternate electives
 - Sometimes students do not get their top choices due to conflicts or availability
- What if your student does not like their elective?
 - It is challenging to change electives and may result in a whole schedule being changed

- World Language classes are academic electives and require nightly homework and practice
- The World Language Exam is given by FCPS in the Fall and is an opportunity for native speakers to earn between 1 to 3 high school credits in a language. Details will be shared when available.
 * High School Credit Class- will appear on the high school transcript
- It is not a requirement to take a World Language course in middle school

Longfellow Middle School Curriculum Night AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) The ideal AVID student has average grades (2's and 3's), goal to go to college and willingness to work hard in rigorous curriculum.

Students will:

- learn writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading skills that will help you be successful in all of your classes in middle school, high school, and college
- explore career interests and colleges/universities
- be a part of a class culture of a high achieving community of scholars
- take field trips to college campuses and host guest speakers from the community to learn more about college and careers

- Semester 1 = 1st and 2nd quarter / Semester 2 = 3rd and 4th quarter
- Students do not select which semester they take an elective
- Students get a new schedule after 2nd quarter which shows their 2nd semester elective
 - Only the elective and sometimes Health and PE period will change
- Most semester classes will contain 7th and 8th grade students

- Level IV Advanced Academic students will be placed in AA English, AA US History, and AA Science.
 - Only Level IV students designated by AAP central office are eligible for these classes.
- Longfellow is All Honors which means that all teachers and classes access Critical and Creative Thinking strategies and opportunities for advanced rigor.

Honors Classes

- Open enrollment: students and families self-select classes in areas of strength or interest
- Increased depth and complexity in specific subject areas
- Students learn with other students who have chosen to be challenged academically in that subject area
- Students may enroll in 1, 2, 3, or 4 Honors courses
- Offered in all middle schools

Full-Time AAP Services

- Students are found eligible through central screening process
- Increased depth, complexity, and pace in all subjects
- Students identified as having high intellectual ability are clustered in classes with peers
- Students are in advanced classes for all 4 core subject areas (math class is based on readiness)
- 14 schools are designated as centers
