Session Descriptions

Special Education Program Overview

Course Requests 101

Counselors will provide tips for balancing academic rigor with personal interests, ensuring a well-rounded schedule for the upcoming school year. Math Course Placement

World Languages

Key Facts & Insights for Rising 7th Graders

2024-25 Longfellow Bell Schedule

<p>Courses: Students have 8 classes on their schedule. All students take English, US History (7th) or Civics (8th), Life Science (7th) or Physical Science (8th), Math (varies), Health and PE, Learning Seminar (see below for details), and two electives of their choosing.</p>
<p>Learning Seminar: Learning Seminar (LS) is the designated block where students receive extra support, engage in enrichment activities, and participate in school-wide lessons and activities. It occurs Tuesday-Friday.</p>
<p>Lunch: We have four lunch sessions each day, and students' lunch time is based on their 5th and 6th period class. Students will learn their lunch block on the first day of school.</p>
<p>Electives: Students may choose two electives. We do our best to place students in their top choices, but sometimes due to space and schedule conflicts, students are placed in another class.</p>
<p>Lockers: All students receive lockers at the beginning of the year and must store their backpacks in their lockers during the school day.</p>
<p>Bell Schedule (see image on right): Students attend all classes on Mondays (Anchor day). On Blue days, students attend classes 1, 3, 5, and 7 and on Silver days, they attend classes 2, 3, 6, and 8. This schedule changes during weeks where there is a student holiday and can be found on Student Central.</p>
<p>Kiss and Ride: Student drop off begins at 7:00 am at Door 4.</p>
<p>PE Uniforms: Health and PE teachers will sell uniform t-shirts through class once the year has started.</p>
<p>Recess: Students have 15-minute outdoor recess everyday, unless the weather requires indoor recess.</p>
